


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Editorial by Alison Skelton



SUMMER and what we do in the Shadows...

A word before commencing: I realized as I was writing this bit that it is actually part of a much (much!) longer piece and I've tried to simply offer a few things to think about. This isn't an article about judgments of other's lifestyles or career choices – simply about reclaiming our personal authority as humans who are anticipating and creating new paradigms...

Ah, Summer! We wait all year for this very season, even if we truly appreciate the others; the inception of this flourishing, beautiful time when the Earth (at least that part we call home) sings forth in the colors and scents of flora, the varying sounds of life offered by birds, insects and other fauna, and the increasingly warm temperature. The returning sunlight kisses us, urging us to expose more skin to the Elements; winds gentle, and that early spring smell of rot has given way to more subtle and pleasing fragrances as plants tempt pollinators to participate in their fertility rituals.

And while everything loosens and relaxes into fertile expansion, our thoughts often turn to themes of playfulness and enjoyment: love and romance, a celebration of the sensual and erotic, our Divine sexuality, and possibly even a return to the innocence of our younger selves. We find ourselves frolicking more, antsy, or wishing to be languid under some shady trees, with our full picnic baskets and no agenda rather than sitting at a desk in some windowless office for eight hours a day, attempting to ignore the "itch." No matter how old we are, the kid in us returns and demands attention. Sometimes this leads us down dark paths; we may find ourselves experiencing anything from a simple anticipation for the workday's end to deep reservoirs of resentment and other murky emotions. Sometimes our emotional selves turn to the shadows where our personal haunts reside – and make no mistake about it; our haunts are deeply personal!

In my own youth, while pursuing a film major at university, and as the daughter of a lapsed Catholic mother who found me "distasteful," I found myself haunted by our cultural concepts of pornography, and set out to investigate this issue as the topic of one of my films. I had difficulty accepting how our sexuality could be construed as "pornographic," especially when we were constantly being bombarded with images and ideas that were deeply offensive, even damaging, to our psyches and perhaps our very Souls in their impact. Hence, as a result, my film consisted of contrasts between some charming still images, garnered from an Art book I'd found in our library depicting the (Greek Goddess of Love) Aphrodite's romantic escapades, with other images I personally found distressing, such as a mother discovering the dead body of her son who had been shot at a local pub, a man crippled by the effects of

contaminated food he had had been forced to eat for most of his life, and a group of nine-year old girls in uniform, each holding a military weapon – and smiling as they were being taught to "hate the enemy!" I used the music "Mars" from Hans Holst's suite, *The Planets*, as the soundtrack because it so convincingly represents threat, and titled the work "Turbulence" as it was intended to upset the apple cart.

My film was completed somewhat prior to the theatre release of Bonnie Sherr Klein's film "Not a Love Story" – a film I was never able to actually view because it consistently sold out in theatres before I could get a ticket! If you aren't familiar with the subject matter, Bonnie's film is "...a thought-provoking chronicle of two women...as they explore the world of peep shows, strip joints and sex supermarkets...motivated by a desire to know more about pornography – why it exists, *the form it takes* (italics mine), and how it affects relations between men and women..."

The form it takes...Well, *that* phrase begged me to look below the surface of the issue as it was being presented. In its most basic interpretation, the word *pornography* derives from Ancient Greek and literally refers to "writing about harlots," but what we must bear in mind is the existence of slavery at that time as a way of life which featured the *buying and selling of humans for a variety of purposes*; in that specific case, the purpose of sexual activities.

The very act of buying and selling humans immediately brings to my mind the dominance of some humans over others (Starhawk would say, "power over"). It conjures that sense of inequality, misogyny and the disruption of personal will which heavily underscores the patriarchal world view and agenda. So, for me, the "pornographic" essentially seeks to divide us into different camps: the dominators and those being dominated. It is also whatever hurts and debases us, whatever blankets us in shame, assaults and offends our deepest senses; it is exploitative and insinuates itself into that part of us which is vulnerable, seeking to destroy our individual sense of Self, to create simply another "consumer," or perhaps more properly, one who can easily be *consumed*; it bulldozes the inner planes, forcing a belief that depth, beauty and meaning are irrelevant and obsolete. It reflects the disillusionment a culture, and a worldview which is actually at the end of its age.

And that dominance is held in place through ensuring that we internalize our feelings of inferiority, that we "know our place," that we essentially become haunted by our own unique Shadows into believing there is something "wrong" with us – and so often it shows up in those realms which ought to be pleasurable, sometimes turning pleasure into a distorted version of itself, e.g., food anxiety, body image anxiety, performance anxiety. It is the appropriation of our deep selves by commercial dominator dynamics – how many diet ads have you seen today? How many ads that try to tell you that you will be happier, more popular, more successful if you purchase their products, implying that you are naturally "less than" without them? *Have you seen any that affirm you, that say you are lovely, whole, good just as*

you are? (This is not to imply that you couldn't or wouldn't benefit from counselling or therapy, but does not automatically assume that you are "damaged goods.")

This is a far cry from the erotic, which seeks to entice us into our own deep sensual and sexual enjoyment! Eros invites exploration, it does not dictate, nor does not colonize. Eros calls us to investigate, it does not insult nor damage us (sure, we might skin our knees hiking a mountainside or fall out of bed because we are rambunctious in our lovemaking, but our Souls remain intact!)

Perhaps it is time to take ourselves back to the mythic Garden and to take another bite of the fruit of that Tree of Knowledge so that we can finally develop our discernment about what is right for us as individuals and what is not, even though it may be right for someone else. We will have plenty of time to explore our noncorporeal Beingness; this is our opportunity to explore the realms of the senses.

Across the Wheel from Samhain, this is another time when the veils between the realms are "thin," making this an excellent opportunity to venture into the depths, especially our own.

Wishing you a deeply sensual, lovingly embraced, life-affirming and beautiful Summer season.

To taste.... Anything cooked by Sean O'Connell:

Summer celebrations and foods are often linked to courtship and sensuality. Aphrodisiacs, 'exotic', hard to produce and short-lived ingredients play central themes in the foods of this season. It's the beginning of the planting season, so there are still few crops to harvest. Locally, the first foods tend to be wild early berries such as salmon berries, and other perennials such as asparagus, baby fiddleheads & cattails. It's also the tail end of the nettle season.

In Imbolc, milk and eggs were starting to be produced, during the Beltane season (and Eostre before it), chickens are in full egg-laying mode and milk is being produced with wild abandon, creating an abundance of these food items, and with them an abundance of soft, early cheeses. When one combines these ingredients with the dried grains from the previous autumn harvest, we have all the ingredients for baking.

With ingredients like that, who would not want to make a quiche - or frittata if you are avoiding the grains in the crust?

Asparagus and Nettle Quiche

Ingredients: ¹/₂ tablespoon of clarified butter (or oil of your choice) 8 – 12 tender asparagus spears – woody ends removed and cut into 2 cm lengths 4 cups fresh nettles 1/8 cup chopped chives 5 large eggs (no less than 1 cup by volume) One cup of milk ¹/₂ cup of hard cheese shredded Salt & pepper to season 9" pie crust (if using) ¹/₂ cup soft goat Chèvre (to put on top) *Directions:* If you are making the pie/quiche shell, prepare in advance and chill in the fridge until ready to use. Preheat oven to 375 degrees F.

In a large sauté pan, heat the ghee. Cook the cut asparagus for about five minutes (should still have a bit of a crunch to it) and put aside. In the same heated pan, add the nettles and sauté. Add more ghee if needed. Once cooked and wilted, place in a colander and firmly squeeze out all the liquid from the nettles.


In a large bowl, whisk together eggs and milk. Season with salt & pepper. In the pie shell, place all sautéed asparagus & nettle with the chives and shredded hard cheese. Pour the egg mix into the shell and place into the oven. Bake for 45 minutes(ish) until the egg is set and slight browned. Remove from the oven, let cook for 15 minutes, then spread the goat Chèvre on top of the quiche. Cut and serve.

Can I Rest with Uncertainty? By Julia Stolk



The Wise Fool, Tarot Card, Kevan Lane Miller

A million ways to say no.

A million ways for the mind to show me why.

Uncertainty is just that – the not knowing. And when asked, can I rest with uncertainty, there is an immediate response heard that says no. And a felt sense of tightening in the body that says there is an agreement with the mind. Many of us, if not most of us, have experienced traumas in our childhood. Some traumas too horrific for re-telling, and others, almost too small to believe they could affect the system as they did. But...the body senses/interprets the world of form in such a different way than the mind. It holds the story, it keeps it all locked away, in both safe keeping and protection for us and from us. So, when we arrive to this continued experience of Covid, a time where no one can tell us when a sense of true normalcy will return, there lies uncertainty.

This uncertainty may be for some a long overdue period of rest, an opportunity to slow down. Others, an intense period of anxiety, fear, loss. And there may be a time, even for those in a state of rest and recovery, where anxiety, fear and loss enter. As days have turned into weeks, and weeks turned into months, I notice an ever growing stirring in the body - anxiety. I hear myself say, I can do this for my fellow beings. I can maintain physical distance. I can continue to mask. And what I notice is that there is a "no" creeping in. It's that tightening in the belly again. A tightening and lifting of the shoulders. A tightening in the brow. There is a feeling of becoming braced – braced for the unknown. And that is the response of our body to trauma. The noticing of what is going on in our external world, whether in our immediate or external reality. Our bodies and mind are constantly determining the level of safety in our environment, all mostly unconscious, and all mostly informed by our past. This past is both our own, and that of our family (epigenetics) and our ancestors, but that is for another day.

Here. In this moment, is the offering of an invitation, to arrive to this present moment in our lives. How you arrive to the present moment does not have to be prescriptive, we each have our own way. Some of us use breath, some use mantra, others find stillness in movement. And whatever your dropping in is, or arrival to this present moment looks, this is the place from which to notice. What are your thoughts that come in response to, "can you rest in uncertainty", noticing without judging, labeling, or interpreting. And if a thought or many thoughts pull you away, can you invite yourself back to this moment? Again, without judgement. All is allowed here. What if the mind was simply doing what it is asked, and curiosity simply just wanted to follow? For me, there is a softening that comes with that, an allowance to come back to present. Of course, there are times when I get completely lost in the landscape of questions, sometimes for hours before I realize I have moved away from present.

And now, as you arrive back to present, and you rest in your place of stillness, can you also include the body? Notice what it is telling you. Like the noticing of my tightening belly, shoulders, and brow. Again, inviting the possibility to sit without judging, labeling or interpreting, but simply allowing. This place of allowance takes practice. It can be incredibly uncomfortable, it can be incredibly provoking, it can be incredibly informing. I leave you with this invitation.

Find a quiet place.

Whether it's on your cushion, in your car, on your bed, at your kitchen sink.
If only for a few minutes, invite your attention to be with you exactly where you are.
And notice.
Your thoughts.
Your body's talk.
Notice if you can allow the thoughts, images and feeling sensations to just be here,
In this exact moment.
And there is no getting it right.
No getting it perfect.

Simply just an exploration to notice what is here in this space, Speaking to us when we listen

Sending you all so much love and light. Holding you in the place of the heart. As we navigate in this time of uncertainty, may you be reminded you matter, you belong.

This card is ruled by Leo, the fixed fire sign, whose energy is bold, brave, generous and playful.

The lion in this Tarot Trump is red, the colour of passion, vitality, and action.

Lions are usually connected with the masculine solar deities but, in Goddess worship, they are associated with Hathor as the sphinx and Cybele, whose chariot was drawn by lions.

The Woman is dressed in white, she is the pure "virgin" goddess, in the old sense of the term. She represents our authentic Spiritual Self, independent of patriarchal domination, a free agent, expressing love and power as she chooses.

The two figures depict our relationship to our own power, both spiritual and physical, and the many advantages, and pitfalls that this dynamic can present. Pure spirit and pure passion, when equally strong, can be expressed in many ways, some more workable than others.

The Lady is often seen opening or closing the jaws of the lion, or caressing it, and some times she looks onto it's mouth. The lion is like her Power Animal, an elemental ally which must be respected, honoured and embraced, lest it turn on her or abandon her. Neither has more power than the other, and their relationship must be consciously cultivated in order for both to thrive.

How do we choose to wield our power? Will we apologize for it, close its mouth? Open up and roar it out, or bite someone's head off? Use it to persuade, protect, oppress, encourage, protest? Or will we cooperate with it and allow it to be expressed as an integral part of our authentic self? Our integrity comes into question here; are we honouring our word, and walking our spiritual talk? Are our actions aligned with our intentions? Are we more interested in holding power than in cooperating with other powerful beings? Do we play nicely within our relationships, or do we try to gain the upper hand? Is it more important to be right than to be compassionate?

And if knowledge is power, how we will use it? With spiritual consciousness, or from a place of ego? Knowledge can easily be abused, often unconsciously, and our evolving spiritual consciousness can become a ego based tool to exert power over others!

A garland of red roses entwine the two figures in a double loop like the infinity sign that is above them. This "rose wreath" or "rosary" acts as a "hand-fasting" garland, marrying the woman and the lion and showing how they are inextricably intertwined. This indicates the constant and perpetual exchange of energies that this archetype represents. Roses were sacred to the goddess in many cultures and the red rose has become a symbol of spiritual sexual passion, eternal and constant.

The woman engages, and perhaps merges with the beast, in an active cooperation between the purity of spirit and the passion of the soul. Masculine and Feminine energies are working together, creating a potent alchemy also known as the Great Marriage, where equality of power is a cooperative expression of consciousness. Together they express the vitality of physical sexual energy coupled with spiritual consciousness.

The vows that we make to ourselves and that we exchange with the ones we love must not be based on domination and control of the other, or on abdicating our sovereignty. All relationships are like contracts, they must be negotiated with consciousness. All parties must have power for a marriage of this nature to thrive.

The Strength card puts it all into practice in an exuberant physical expression of lust for life, for one another, and for the experience of cooperative power and knowledge. The great marriage is now consummated and expressed in very active terms in full agreement and acceptance of diversity. We abandon our ego's desire for merely sensual experience, taking joy in our transformational strength and energy.

Strength is where life and love can get wild, messy, complicated and out of control. If either the Lion or the Lady become too strong, or too weak and neglected, we will suffer, and can start playing our relationship power games to try to compensate. Sexual energy is very powerful, but ultimately it is ours to express as we so chose, and no one can force us to feel passion. The Lady has the choice to open or close her lion's jaws, either is fine if it is her will. Strength represents qualities that take a lot of energy to maintain. Courage, will power, passion, cooperation, generosity, integrity, honour, trust, and respect; these are the ingredients needed to maintain our primary relationships, both internal and external.

The Thirteenth Sign of the Zodiac By Rosechild





An interesting tidbit came up on the CBC Kelowna morning show, Mindbreakers, related to this weeks' theme of horoscopes. I've always been interested in astrology, but never delved into it too-too deeply. Other than from the first weekly horoscopes in the local Salmon Arm Observer in the late '60's, to forking out unknown amounts of cash on personalized readings. (Notably from renowned and incredibly insightful Astrologers like Jessica North-O'Connell and Renn Butler, to many less talented practitioners...)

Suffice to say it has always been a part of my life's periphery. So when the question of the day was, "What is the long hidden constellation that used to be a part of the astrology cabal, called the Serpent Bearer", I did what many people do these days, I "Googled" it.

I was fascinated to discover Ophiuchus, (pronounced off-ee-YOO-cuss).

Apparently, the first recorded mention of Ophiuchus was around 300BC, and there is evidence the Babylonians recognised it much earlier. But the zodiac signs – the constellations the sun passes through across the year – were restricted to 12 by emperors, popes and astrologers for convenience. And also an attempt to quash the feminine influence in world.



"So, if you were born at the start of December you are actually an Ophiuchus instead of a Sagittarius? That's the idea.

So instead of "adventurous, optimistic and good with horses", you're what? A snakehandling oddball? It affects everyone: the presence of Ophiuchus shunts all the other signs along. People who thought their star sign was Gemini are now Taurus.

That's impossible. I don't have any Taurus traits. Are you sure? Tauruses are kind and patient but also stubborn and uncompromising. Oh God! It's all true! Why has Nasa1 done this? It hasn't, really. The blog post – written in 2016 – has been largely, perhaps willfully, misunderstood. Nasa's main point was that dates assigned to constellations are completely off any way because constellations are different sizes – Ophiuchus is the biggest – and there are as many as 21.

Does this mean we need to completely rethink the entire zodiac system in order to produce accurate horoscopes? No, we don't need to do that.

Why not? Because astrology is nonsense.

What do you mean? It doesn't work, and it never has. The stars do not affect your personality, your romantic prospects, your financial situation or your future.

But astrology is ancient.

Ancient rubbish. I'm sorry.

But the sun ... The sun does not actually travel through constellations. It just looks like that, because the Earth is orbiting around the sun.

But Nasa ... Nasa knows all this, and deep down, so do you.

If I'm not a Gemini, then I don't know what I am. You can still be a Gemini for the purposes of making small talk with people at drinks parties. That's something, I suppose. (Not really, but whatever.)

Do say: "Avoid handling serpents today, and tomorrow, and the next day."

Don't say: "This could be the moment you realise that your whole life has been meaningless up to this point."

Another great interweb page has more about the caduceus connection to Ophiuchus. My friend Dana pointed me to it and had this to say about it:

"I found one more interesting article [snip] thought this was interesting — the Greeks may have identified him as Asclepius — another connection to the caduceus. And this story has a Greek explanation for why crows turned from white to black. I have been finding that idea, that crows were originally white and then turned black in several sources - Norse, Coastal BC indigenous legends, and now the Greeks." From the web page:

The Greeks identified him as Asclepius, the god of medicine (Aesculapius in Latin). Asclepius was the son of Apollo and Coronis (although some say that his mother was Arsinoë). The story goes that Coronis two-timed Apollo by sleeping with a mortal, Ischys, while she was pregnant by Apollo. A crow brought Apollo the unwelcome news, but instead of the expected reward the crow, which until then had been snowwhite, was cursed by Apollo and turned black.

In a rage of jealousy, Apollo shot Coronis with an arrow. Rather than see his child perish with her, Apollo snatched the unborn baby from its mother's womb as the flames of the funeral pyre engulfed her, and took the infant to Chiron, the wise centaur (represented in the sky by the constellation Centaurus).

Chiron raised Asclepius as his own son, teaching him the arts of healing and hunting. Asclepius became so skilled in medicine that not only could he save lives, he could also raise the dead. (http://www.ianridpath.com/startales/ophiuchus.html)

I've always been intrigued by the caduceus as a representation of a healer. The snake is also the opposite sign of my Chinese horoscope sign, the monkey. Themes of Sovereignty Seen at Litha

In the Celtic lunar calendar of trees, the summer months include the moons of Oak, Holly and Hazel, and the festivals of Beltaine, Summer Solstice, and Lammas. The Sacred Hallows this season illuminates are the Wand and the Pentacle, the magical instruments of elemental Fire and Light married to Earth and Fertility in harmony. The name Lammas, celebrated on August 1st, was Christianized from the Festival for the Irish light god, Lugh and Welsh Lleu Llaw Gyffes and means 'Loaf Mass.' Lugh or Lleu Llaw Gyffes is a solar light deity also known as 'The Long-armed Spearman,' or 'Spearman with the Long Shaft,' which suggests the lengthening days leading up to the Summer Solstice. He is associated with Holly, both as the Sacred Solstice Tree, and also the Celtic lunar tree month of Holly and as the sacred King. As the 'Holly King,' he also comes into play at Lammas, or the Festival for Lugh, when Ivy Girl 'captures' him after a merry chase by suggestively tossing her holly wreath over the 'head' of his Holly staff. Litha, observed on and as the Summer Solstice, is commemorated by huge bonfires, ritualized observances of the Sacred Marriage of the Goddess as the Earth or Land with the God as the Fire and Light, and by handfasting ceremonies among Witches and Pagans.

The 8th-century monk, Bede, wrote in his 'The Reckoning of Time,' about the summer months, giving "Litha" as the seasonal name for both June and July in the Roman Julian calendar, a term adopted by modern Pagans of every stripe, and Druids observe Midsummer's Day as ancient Welsh 'Alban Heruin.' The lunar Celtic

moon ('month') of Hazel spans the Summer Solstice. The Hazel tree confers "female wisdom" and, like Rowan and Willow, is considered a quintessential Witch tree ("Witch Hazel"). The Irish Celtic Sea God Manannán mac Lir (Welsh, Manawydan fab Llyr, Lord of the 'People of the Goddess, Dana) gave Lugh his initiatory magical armor and is also associated with Hazel; the wisdom-conferring well fed by nine magical Hazel trees stood in his fairy hall. Manannán also possessed a Cauldron of Regeneration and a Shaman's "Crane Bag," which contained all the esoteric wisdom of the Druid, including poetry, chants, incantations, divination, symbolism, history and the lore and secret significance of all things. That is knowledge was considered "women's magic" from the earliest times is evident in the legend that the Crane Bag was said to be made from the skin of a woman; Woman contained the inspired wisdom of evolution and rebirth, like the Hazel nuts in the legends, as magical, divine women were thought to be capable of shape-shifting into Crane form.



Every woman carries within her the genetic code that marked the evolution of the first human woman. The "Mitochondrial Eve" theory refers to this phenomenon, whereby each woman carries the DNA or genetic blueprint of the first human female in the mitochondrial lining of every cell. As the Divine Ancestress, the Original Woman is the human Clan Mother, and the actual stuff of her revolutionary design passes, intact, through the female line. This may be why, in many cultures past and present, sovereignty and "royal blood" was originally traced through the mother, and why "kingship" was conferred through marriage to a royal woman, mythologized as Guinevere, Blodeuwedd, Epona, Elaine, Isis, and others. The complete record of evolutionary changes that render us "human" are passed on only

through the female line. A "sacred marriage" between the candidate for kingship and the Goddess was a traditional means of elevating the newly crowned king to his throne. The Mother Goddess archetype contains the concepts of genetic memory, wisdom, maternal protection and resurrection.

An understanding of this ancient human lineage from the Original Mother underscored the most ancient concepts of the Goddess held by our ancestors. Many traditions practice ancestor worship, honoring those who have gone before and who have left us their legacy. Linking to ancestral wisdom and informing it with our current knowledge will enable us to proceed more wisely into our collective future.



Hazel month spans the Summer Solstice and the event of the sun entering the sign of Cancer. The Hazel Rune is Kaunaz, meaning hearth fire, forge, creativity, passion, craft and instinct, but also blemish. Gwion was scarred by Cerridwen's scalding potion conferring wisdom, but was thereby transformed into the legendary Bard, Taliesin. The Gaelic name for Hazel is Coll, and its letter is C. Hazel nuts were once thought to contain enlightenment, visions, and poetic inspiration. The Solstice also falls under the influence of Cancer, the watery denizen of deep emotions and sensitive perception. Nut trees of all types are characteristic of this Solstice, and of the hard-shelled richness of its Cancerian quality. The Apple tree shares this Sabbat, called "Quert" ("koo airt") in the Celtic lunar tree calendar , and fruit trees of all kinds are appropriate to remember here. This is a time when deeply submerged wisdom may emerge into conscious awareness. The encoded, genetic wisdom of generations of female ancestors may come forward to inspire the actions of the

present, forth this is the time of Mother-Wisdom. The Isis-like ability to intuitively know what is right in certain situations, like the High Priestess card of the Tarot, may inform your choices, and if you choose to verbalize your choices your words will be well chosen and judicious. You may find that you have the capacity to inspire others and they you. Flow of energy is the character of this month, and an appreciation for the fertile and renewing properties of water.

Blodewedd (Welsh pronunciation: blo'de-weth) is from Middle Welsh for "Flower-Faced." She is the supernatural wife of Lleu Llaw Gyffes, the solar hawk god, in Welsh mythology.

She was made from Nine Sacred Flowers, including Broom, Meadowsweet, and Oak by the magicians Math and Gwydion. She is a central figure in Math fab Mathonwy, the last of the Four Branches of the Mabinogion. Guinevere is a version of the Flower Maiden, whom Arthur married in order to ensure his covenant with Albion, an ancient name for England.

Blodewedd's animal avatar is Owl, and the honorific, 'Flower Face,' also applies to Owl, owing to the owl face resembling a pansy flower. Owl bestows the ability to see in the dark, to hunt and pinpoint Truth with accuracy, to communicate with The Ancestors, to pierce the shadows of depression or obscurity, to travel in the Otherworld, to journey to all realms of the Tree of Life, and to see beyond the veil. She is the Bride in all Her glory.

Traditional Summer Solstice motifs survive within modern national sovereignty feasts, outdoor picnics and fireworks celebrations. In Europe, feasts surrounding St. John's Day preserve many ancient, Summer Solstice motifs, including bathing in sacred wells of various Goddesses and weaving wreaths of the nine sacred flowers to the ornamenting of wells in honor of the Flower Maiden, Blodeuwedd. Outside of Pagan communities' observances of Summer Solstice, people mark these traditional celebratory modes during the early July festivities of Memorial Day picnics. (The province of Quebec celebrates St. Jean-Baptiste Day, June 24th.) Certain archetypal

images, which have to do with the theme of clan regencies, have survived in the observances of Mother's Day, Father's Day, Memorial Day (honoring the ancestors), and, of course, American 4th of July. July 4th marks America's independence from a king, and the beginning of self-rule, or ultimate national and personal sovereignty. (By contrast, July 1st, Dominion, or Canada Day, commemorates the formation of Canada as a dominion, a self-governing territory under another's rule.) The remarkable thing about Independence Day's proximity to the Summer Solstice is that Midsummer was, for time immemorial, the occasion for the Rites of Sovereignty, when the King was invested to the throne and married the Goddess as the land.

We are well on the path of Summer now and Beltaine has come and brought the furthering light as we planted and fertilized our intentions. The spirits of nature are blessing us with birdsong and flowers and the well deserved boost of initiation and ignition we need to plan the coming months. Litha reminds us that whatever seeds

we planted will have taken root and be pushing down into the darkness just as leaf and flower have emerged to reach for the ripening sun.

This is a great time to tend to the garden of the self. An opportunity to weed out that which is not thriving, or is taking up space that is needed for newer growth. Some weeds are invasive, like thought forms that spread unwanted messages throughout the garden, choking out paradise. It's also important to make sure that we are fertilizing that which we wish to grow strong and vigorous, and providing proper support, and access to the optimal ratio of light and shade. The waters of life are essential too: nurturance, creativity, emotional expression and honouring of the cycles and rhythms of growth and emergence. Often the roots of the thoughts are not even mine, sneaking under the fence, they are part of the cultural neighbourhood. And crabgrass, likewise, reminds me of how easily these old patterns of thought can take over if allowed to run wild.





Review:


Adopting the framework of the ancient Celtic worldview, Yvonne Owens weaves the reader into the fabric of the Story, juxtaposing the initiatory process with extensive multi-cultural references. Miles Lowry's artwork and poetry add another magical

dimension to the work. In the tradition of path-working, the reader becomes transformed through participation while exploring the archetypal Tree of Life/Tree of Knowledge. The result is the awakening and activation of the profound heart of the Artist who dwells within each one of us awaiting realization. A shift in consciousness is enabled as we travel with (or as) the Bard from the Garden to the Realm Beyond the Stars and back again, arriving with fresh new perspectives on the here-and-now, our perceived everyday lives. The author recommends that the journey through the process be allowed to proceed over the course of a year, in the manner of initiation, so as to allow for the awakening of subtle influences within the reader's inner consciousness, intuition and creative self. During this time, the outer life will synchronously mirror the inner processes.





Yvonne's book on these ancient mysteries presents a cosmological map to the Celtic otherworld of Traditional Celtic Shamanism, hidden and encoded in folk and fairy tales. The Journey of the Bard is a beautiful book, published by Horned Owl Press, illustrated and designed by Miles Lowry, an internationally renowned artist from Victoria, BC. Miles also wrote the poems that face each chapter, as a means to enter into and access the imagery entailed in the timeless, sacred narrative.

The book tells the tale of a seeker's journey through the realms of the Tree of Life 'Rainbow Body,' activated through the unimpeded movement of Life Force Energy, or 'Chi,' spiraling through the Chakras. It can be seen as an intrinsic, divinely designed, conscious energy dynamic we are all 'hardwired' with. Through the body, we commune with the World Soul, Gaia, She who is so eager to communicate through (and as) our personal and collective awareness. Because of this, our essential communion is with our own Inner Teachers, Power Animals, and Guides. Self-realization transforms us with love of Self in recognition of ourselves as vital parts of the whole – incarnated reflections of Spirit. From this unity flows the ability to teach, to heal, to minister to suffering on every level and on a grand scale, to choreograph transformative soul evolution in the individual and in the collective, and to manifest profound, radical change within the world and beyond. This is a concept our ancestors knew well, and the Journey of the Bard transmission of teachings begins and ends with ritual acknowledgement of (and gratitude for) this living, evolving world.

Yearlong Training in Practical Animism: The Path of the Priestess

Priestess is not a lofty concept of floating in the upper realms of love and light and serving the Goddess. Priestess is about embodying the Goddess and doing Her work on Earth, serving the people in her community. A priestess is an animist. Animism comes from the Latin word anima, which means soul. It means that everything is ensouled: animals and plants, rocks, forces of nature like the wind, clouds, water, etc. Everything is sacred. For an animist, the world is a community of persons, only few of which are human and all of which deserve respect. Animism is about living in Right Relationship, to cultivate more alignment and a natural sense of sacred connection to the world around us. It provides a pathway for awakening, healing, and transforming our lives, allowing us to build inner resources and access sacred guidance that bring us home to our highest self and fosters a soul-powered way of living on Mother Earth that truly benefits all.

Over the course of the traditional "Year and A Day", you will dedicate yourself to the Goddess, diving deep into the mysteries of the Divine Feminine, and learn animistic practices for our modern world. This is a Tree Of Life initiation in the tradition of the 13th House Mystery School - universal, non-hierarchical, and sacred.



Similar to our animism training <u>The Path of Shaman</u>, you will explore another realm of the Tree Of Life each month, assemble 12 power stones or power objects, learn self-healing rituals, and more. At the end of this process you will have attuned yourself to the energy of your Attuning Goddess, developed good working relationships with your guides, and assembled the tools you need to answer the question "Why am I here?"— knowing your unique gifts and how you can bring them into the world.

- 1. White Cord initiation, the feminine blood mysteries
- 2. Root Chakra, Earth element: physical & energetic health, boundaries, grounding
- 3. Sacral Chakra, Water element: feelings & emotions, water rituals, forgiveness practice
- 4. Solar Plexus Chakra, Fire element: transformation through death
- 5. Heart Chakra, Air element: mindfulness, compassion
- 6. Throat Chakra, Space element: reclaiming our stories, finding our voice
- 7. Third Eye Chakra: intuition & divination
- 8. Crown Chakra: The Upper World, beings of light, archetypes
- 9. The Divine Feminine balancing & healing feminine archetypes within
- 10. The Divine Masculine balancing & healing masculine archetypes within
- 11. Dreams and Dreamwork dream interpretation, conscious dreaming
- 12. Personal Power & Red Cord Initiation

Since we are taking a shamanic approach to animism, the ability to do shamanic trance journeys to drumbeat is very helpful. This is taught in our introductory workshop <u>The Shamanic Journey</u>. A free question-and-answer session about the yearlong training programs follows each introductory workshop.

Training options include:

Group training at a distance consists of monthly lesson packages in the form of PDF documents and monthly group Zoom calls, plus email support and a sharing group on Facebook with optional outdoor gatherings for group ritual.



Initiation



THE 13th HOUSE MYSTERY SCHOOL TRADITION of WITCHCRAFT AND SHAMANISM MAINTAINS THE BELIEFS:

* That the Divine Principle is manifest within the personal AND the collective Self.

* That any and all initiatory entrance into this revealed Mystery is undertaken by virtue of Self Realization.

* That all people carry within them the knowledge of their own perfect and unique Path.

* And That we of the Thirteenth House Mysteries Tradition, as Initiating Priestesses and Priests, serve merely as facilitators of entry into the Individual, Collective, and ultimately Personal Mystery.

Structure of Tradition:

Circle or Clan structure, interconnecting groups of one to thirteen individuals, ideally.

Founders of Tradition:

Nine Founding Priestesses, all of whom were Initiatrix.

Growth, Expansion of Tradition:

The structure allows for "hiving-off" from founding body into sub-groups.

Rank and Hierarchy of Tradition:

None. There is one initiation into the Mystery, whereupon Priestesses or Priests choose their Avocation. The core structure is directed toward upon Self-Expression through Creative Acts, with a focus upon Art, Performance, Writing, Healing or Teaching. A further Initiation into the personal legacy of genetic or soul lineage is available for those who are called to create, perform, heal or teach under the auspices of the Thirteenth House Mystery Tradition, whereupon the Priestess or Priest is entitled to represent the Tradition, and pass it on through initiation, if they so choose.

Initiation into Tradition:

Any and all Initiations into the Personal Mystery of the Thirteenth House Tradition are to be undertaken after an apprenticeship to the Tradition for a period of time lasting A Year and a Day of study, observation and introspection, as well as the Tree of Life initiation.


Dogma, Doctrine and Credo of Tradition:

In that this is a Revealed Mystery Tradition, no one dogma, lore or Book of Shadows is obligatory for Initiates, Priestesses, or Priests of the Tradition. Each individual is empowered within the collective to formulate their own mythos, theology, theory, and practice within the Wiccan Rede, including that of Shamanism. The Wiccan Rede states: If it harms no one, do as you will.

Functions of the Thirteenth House Mystery Tradition:

- To provide a matrix with leadership for Self Realization for individuals within the collective.
- To provide public classes, to conduct rituals, and facilitate Initiation into the Mystery of the Tradition, when appropriate.
- To provide private, personal teaching and guidance when Initiation into the Tradition is appropriate, within the context of Wicca and Shamanism.
